Understanding Collaborative Contracting and Its Implications

WORKSHOP OVERVIEW

Since as early as 2017, the government has been encouraging a shift towards collaborative contracting models, which seek to overcome issues that frequently arise from the adoption of more conventional approaches. Collaborative contracting models are premised on the belief that a more co-operative, as opposed to adversarial, working relationship can lead to mutual benefits for both the project owner and project participants in the wider and longer term. While the public sector has taken the lead, it is hoped that there will be increased uptake within the private sector in future, as the industry deepens its understanding of collaborative contracting and its implications.

INSIGHTS

In this workshop, the speakers will

- Examine the fundamental principles and elements of collaborative contracting, and how it compares with traditional contracting.
- Different collaborative contracting frameworks with varying degrees of risk/reward-sharing and cooperation will also be considered.
- Cover some of the key collaborative provisions under standard forms of contract such as the PSSCOC and NEC3 and NEC4.
- Discuss and share factors that contribute to successful implementation, potential challenges and pitfalls, as well as actual examples of collaborating contracting.
